Minority (General):

- American Chemical Society (ACS) Scholars—Applicant must be an **African-American, Hispanic/Latino, or Native American** (including Native Hawaiian and Alaskan Native) with a minimum 3.0 GPA. Eligible majors are **chemistry, chemical-related science**.

- American Meteorological Society (AMS)/Industry Minority Scholarships—Scholarships help support the college educations of minority students traditionally underrepresented in the sciences, especially **Hispanic, Native American, and Black/African American** students, **who intend to pursue careers in the atmospheric or related oceanic and hydrologic sciences**. Minority students who will be entering their freshman year of college are eligible to apply.

- Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship—Candidates must be **minority high school seniors**, US Citizens, accepted to a four-year accredited college or university; with SAT score of 900 or above; or ACT score of 23 or above; possess leadership potential and have a financial need.

- The Gates Millennium Scholars—funded by a grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, was established in 1999 to provide outstanding **African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American, and Hispanic American** students with an opportunity to complete an undergraduate college education in all discipline areas and a graduate education for those students pursuing studies in mathematics, science, engineering, education, public health or library science. Scholarship is available to graduating high school seniors. It provides substantial scholarship awards to exceptional high school seniors for study at the college of their choice. Eligible applicants must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale, demonstrated leadership skills, and significant financial need.

Must have cumulative GPA 3.0 or above (unweighted), demonstrate financial need, entering their first year of college in Fall of 2008.

Hispanic:

- **Community College Transfer Scholarship**—program provides scholarships to **Latino students** transferring from a community college to an approved, accredited higher education institution.

- **The Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute Scholarship Award**—is available to **Latino students** who are enrolled full time in an accredited community college, four-year university or graduate/professional program. You must be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident and demonstrate financial need, good writing skills and consistent participation in public service-oriented activities to be eligible for this award.

- **First in My Family Scholarship Program**—developed in partnership with the Hispanic College Fund, offers scholarships to **Hispanic-American students** who are the first in their family to attend college and have financial need. The program is open to Hispanic Americans who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents enrolled as full time undergraduate students at approved, accredited institutions. Students must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). Scholarships range from \$500 to \$5,000.

- **Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards**—HHYA promotes young leaders who demonstrate success in the classroom and community in an effort to encourage other young people to use education as a vehicle for success. Must be a graduating high school senior who is planning to enroll in college in the fall. Must be a citizen or permanent resident of the US of **Hispanic/Latino descent** (at least one parent). Minimum 3.0 GPA and willing to travel to the awards ceremony in your selected region (Phoenix, AZ).

 - **(HHYA) Engineering and Mathematics sponsored by ExxonMobil**—this category is for applicants who express an interest and skill in **mathematics and engineering** or a wish to pursue a career in the fields of engineering or mathematics.
- **Hispanic Scholarship Fund (HSF)**—HSF provides more college financial aid to the Hispanic community than any other organization in the country, with \$195 million in scholarships granted to date. HSF offers financial aid to graduating high-school seniors, community-college students seeking to transfer to four-year universities, continuing university students seeking to complete their degrees and to students in graduate and professional programs.

- (HSF)/General Motors Scholarship Program—The Hispanic Scholarship Fund (HSF) and General Motors (GM) have partnered to provide financial resources to assist outstanding Latinos pursuing degrees in Engineering and Business. Eligibility requirements must be of **Hispanic heritage**, must have minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0, full-time enrollment, must be majoring in Engineering, Business, or Human Resources.

Must be pursuing a degree in Bio-Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Environmental Management/Science, Environmental/Geological Engineering, or Engineering.

Women (any ethnicity):

- Association for Women in Science—in general, **female students** who are high school seniors and plan to study science in the next academic year may apply. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents who plan to attend a college or university in the United States. Applicants must have a 3.75 high school grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) and a math plus verbal SAT score of at least 1200 or an ACT composite score of 25. Eligible fields include the **behavioral, life, and physical sciences and engineering**.

Disabled and Health Problems:

- Anne Ford Scholarship—The Anne Ford Scholarship is a \$10,000 award given to a high school senior with an **identified learning disability** (LD) who is pursuing an undergraduate degree. The ideal candidate is a high school senior who has faced the challenges of having a learning disability; is committed to completing a college degree and setting career goals; has demonstrated perseverance; embraces new opportunities; has a well-rounded perspective shaped by experiences in school, in the community, and with family and friends; understands how LD affects his/her life and recognizes the importance of self-advocacy; believes in contributing to society in a way that increases the opportunities for individuals with learning disabilities; and will feel comfortable serving as a role model for others who struggle with LD.

- Anne & Matt Harbison Scholarship—\$1,500 scholarship to one high school senior with a **certified language-related learning difference** who is pursuing post-secondary education.

- Catherine Lamphier Scholarship Fund—established by the Arizona Chapter of the Lupus Foundation of America for the purpose of aiding students who have been diagnosed with lupus or whose parents have been diagnosed with lupus. Age requirement is 17-30 years of age, must have GPA of 2.5 or better, must have documented community involvement, **must be lupus patient or have a parent who is a lupus patient**. This needs to be supported by a letter from a Rheumatologist verifying the lupus diagnosis.
